
All these organisations work only in Shropshire and some work in certain parts of the county.

Shropshire Council, like all other councils, is having to save money.

We have to look at how we spend our money to make sure that it goes as far as possible and is spent wisely.



Shropshire Council is working very closely with the organisations who already provide information, advice and advocacy services in Shropshire.

Together we are looking at what works well, how things could look different or work better so that these services can continue to be available in Shropshire.

By working together we can make sure that we provide what is needed in Shropshire for all the people who need information, advice and advocacy.



Next year there are further changes coming from the Government in the Care Bill.

Shropshire Council needs to make sure that it will provide all that is set out by the Care Bill.



We have to start looking now at what we have to do sooner rather than later. But this does not mean that people will see big changes in October 2014 – changes will happen over time.

We hope that by making these changes, then we will be able to continue paying for information, advice and advocacy services.

- Help local communities and the county of Shropshire
- Services to be flexible to meet current needs and future changes
