

Have Your Say on Day Centres



Tell us what you think about changes to Day Centres





Shropshire Council wants to hear from people who use Day Centres. They want to know what people think about changes to these services. This includes families, carers, and the public.



Day Centres help people make friends and become more independent. They also give carers a break. But, fewer people are using them, and money is tight. So, the council needs to look at how they run these services.



There are 29 Day Centres in Shropshire. Eight of these are run by the council. They want to make these services better and more modern.



The council wants to help people find jobs and volunteer work. Some people will still need Day Centres, but others might work or volunteer instead.



The council has three ideas for change. First, they want to close **Helena Lane Day Centre**. The building will still be used for other things.



Second, they want to move **Aquamira Day Centre** to **Abbots Wood**. The pool at Aquamira will not move, but people can use other services.



Third, they want to change some **Day Centres** to make them better for everyone. This might mean new activities or ways to help people.



The changes will save money. **Helena Lane** and **Aquamira** cost a lot to run. The changes will save about £222,380 each year



Only 23 people will be directly affected by these changes. **Helena Lane** only has 8 people using it now. There are other services nearby they can use.



The council wants to hear what people think before making any decisions..



The council will write to everyone who uses the **Day Centres**. They want people to fill out a survey to share their thoughts.



The council wants to make sure the services are good and affordable..



The survey will be open for 8 weeks. It will close on **26th March 2026**.
